Peter Sartorius asked for feedback from Frances Ryan and Dick Gardner regarding the Village Green project. Frances Ryan commented that while she would hate to see the trees removed she understood the necessity to widen Jessup Avenue. The Board explained that the creation of new diagonal parking spaces would be for safety reasons. Utility lines would be buried and the green would be more open for Village events.
