A majority of the Quogue Village Beach Stickers have been distributed, and so people may now pick up stickers at the Village Office during normal office hours (9:00 am to 4:00 pm on weekdays). Please allow 5 business days after you submit a properly completed application for processing and remember that the Village Office will be closed on Friday, July 3rd in observance of Independence Day.

At the Village Beach, we are opening the north parking lot to holders of 2020 stickers in the early morning for people who like to have their coffee or take a walk (without their pet, however). You will have to leave the lot by 9:00 am so that the staff has an hour to itself to set up the beach for the day.

Casual observation reveals a lot of trash in town and at public places like the village dock (e.g., yesterday's rotisserie chicken package) and the pond. Please be sure to pick up after yourself and make sure that when you use the trash cans, the material actually goes all the way in. Needless to say (hopefully), trash cans are not for your household garbage.
